Opening Statement

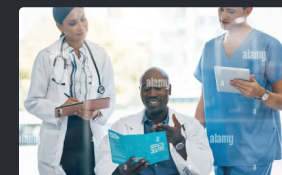
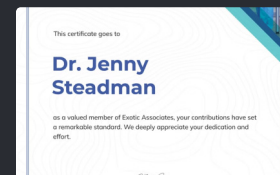

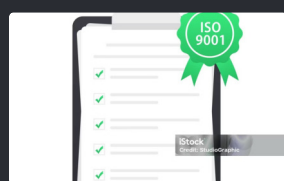

A poorly trained consultant creates misaligned expectations, inappropriate case progressions, and communication failures that no surgeon can fully correct.

Understanding the clinical pathway well enough to support informed decision-making, escalation boundaries, and appropriate referral behaviour.

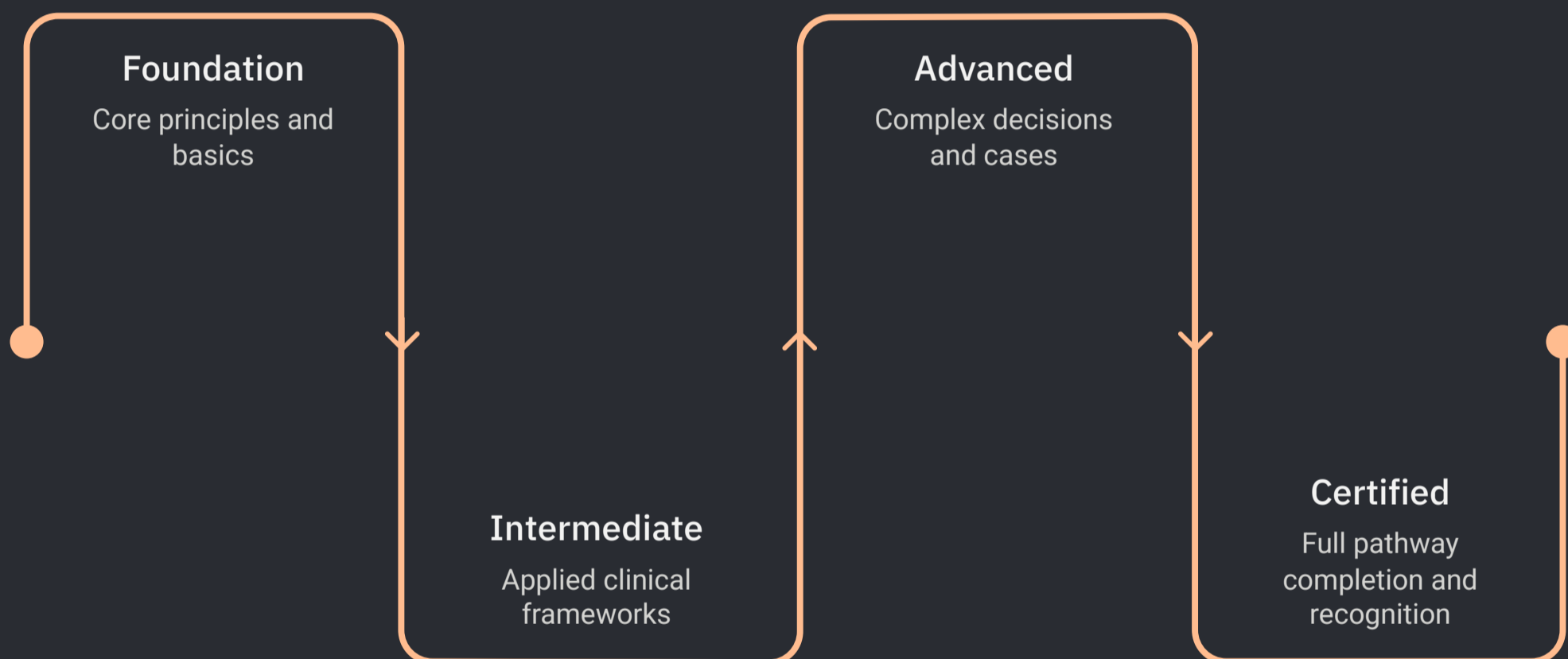
Continuity of Care
